

However, in 2017, former chief minister Lim Guan Eng said that the takeover plan had been put on hold until further discussions with

However, in March 2019, Chief From Jan 1, PPSB, which took Minister Chow Kon Yeow said the state government would not take over the ferry service. He said this was because a study conducted by the state government found that the ferry services would make a loss of between RM10 million and RM15 million a year.

Again in October last year, used to transport bicycles and Chow reiterated that the state government had no plans to take over the ferry service.
